

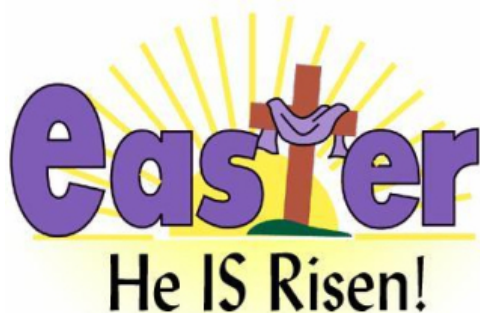

# A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

## ***Revelation 2. 12-17***

“Write this to the angel of the church in Pergamum. : These are the words of the one who has the sharp two-edged sword. I know where you live – where satan has his throne! You have clung on to my name, and have not denied my faith, even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness, who was killed in your midst, in the dwelling place of satan. But I do have a few things against you: you have some people there who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who instructed Balak to cause the children of Israel to stumble, making them eat idol-food and indulge in sexual immorality. So, too, you have some among you who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans. So: repent! If you don't, I will come to you quickly and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth. Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches. To anyone who conquers I will give secret manna, and a white stone, with a new name written on that stone which nobody knows except the one who receives it”.

For a very long time, we in Britain had what we liked to think of as a broadly Christian culture. We used to say we were a ‘Christian country’. Well, if that was ever true, it certainly isn't now. We may find that ourselves, as Christians, finding ourselves more and more out of step with society because of our faith. If this happens, then it's nothing new so do not panic! It will mean however, that we need to make difficult choices: do we compromise our faith in order to fit in (or be ‘relevant...’) or do we hold on to what our faith tells us to be true, as we would to precious treasure?

The church in Pergamum must have felt like a little island in a sea of paganism. Some within the church had succumbed to ungodly influences and their devotion to Christ had consequently suffered. Christ's ‘double-edged’ sword hovers above them, ready to separate truth from error and bring clarity where confusion is creeping in. Sexual immortality is a symptom of this: sexual expression as God intended has become more of a free for all, leading people away from the fruitful, devoted life that is God's will for them. This is idolatry, and the message is clear: Idolatry is toxic and Christians should steer clear. Those who hold firm, are promised a ‘white stone’, with a new name written on it. I find this white stone quite mysterious and I have come across several different explanations for it! I love the idea however, of being given, personally, a white stone, a stone that is particularly ours, with a unique name. Something special shared between

us and God. It seems the rewards of faithfulness far surpass any temporary inconvenience we might suffer in holding firm to our faith and our Lord.

## **Coronavirus - Update from the Methodist Church**

The Methodist Church has announced the closure of all its church buildings for the foreseeable future. The only exception will be for churches that are offering essential social outreach such as foodbanks, soup kitchens and night shelters, but these must be carried out closely within Government guidelines. The Methodist Church suspended worship services last week with some churches still opening for quiet prayer and reflection. This must now also be suspended. We would encourage people to use our online resources at home which include downloadable services and links to online worship services - see link at end.

The Revd Dr Jonathan Hustler, Secretary of the Conference said: “We are asking people to change their way of ‘going to church’ to help to protect themselves and others. We have put in place measures that will enable Methodists still to be part of the worshipping community, whilst for everyone’s sake staying away from church buildings. There is a range of resources available for people to use at home which we hope will help them to continue their cycle of prayer and worship. The Methodist Church is more than its buildings and if in these unprecedented times we can continue our life as Methodists without using our buildings we will help to reduce the chances of transmission of the virus.”
