A Message From The Minister

At the October Church Council, we agreed that from January we would hold Messy Church once a month – there is more detail about this elsewhere in Contact. One of the main reasons for this change was recognising that only holding it four times a year made the forming and developing of relationships difficult. For most of us, and for most of history, faith has been awakened and nurtured and matured within community.

I find this a striking feature of the nativity narratives within Luke and Matthew. The genealogy which begins Matthew's gospel reminds us that Jesus' birth takes place within an ongoing tradition and community of faith. Whilst both Mary and Joseph are visited by angels individually, their message encourages them to seek out others - Mary sets off to Elizabeth, Joseph to honour his commitment to Mary, and together they make their way to Bethlehem. Angels announce the birth to shepherds who travel together to see the newborn Jesus. A star guides the Magi (maybe 3, maybe more), who travel together to the infant Jesus. And after his birth, Jesus is presented in the temple, where Simeon and Anna have been waiting the promised Saviour. Each of these characters in their own way respond in faith to the baby Jesus, but none of the characters is alone. They are each a part of some community.

After Christmas, on 8th January, we shall celebrate our Covenant Service. A service which reminds us of God's generous, faithful and committed love for us, and in which we are invited to respond by renewing our commitment to follow God. Though faith may be deeply personal, the introduction to the Covenant Service in the Methodist Worship Book reminds us that "The covenant is not just a one-to-one transaction between individuals and God, but the act of the whole faith community". Like those seeking the newborn Jesus, we need others to accompany us on the journey of faith, and others need us to accompany them.

Such community does not simply happen. It takes our commitment. Nor does it just take one shape – worship, house groups, visiting, serving, are all ways in which our community of faith is both expressed and maintained. In what ways are you already part of the community of faith at Wonford? Sometimes, as with Messy Church, we may need to review how we are enabling community to take shape, and perhaps even to make changes. As we hear again the familiar stories of Christmas, I encourage you to note the subtle emphasis on community. And as we approach our Covenant Service, may I challenge you to consider your commitment to the community of faith at Wonford, and invite you to renew it together on 8th January.

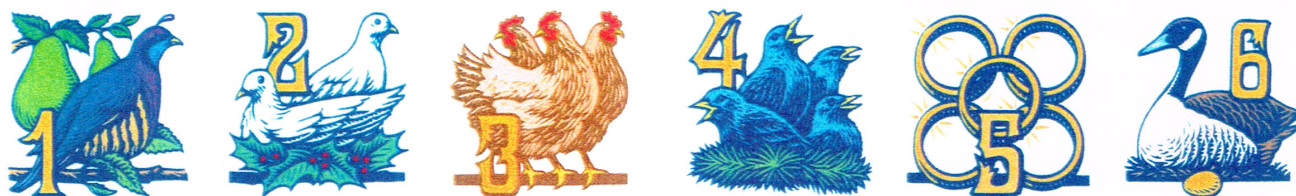


Minister's Monthly Bible Study Group
