A Message From The Minister

Keep silence.

For some of us, this might be one of the harder rhythms of discipleship.

That might be because we are the one always talking! Or because we are the kind of person whose head is always full of ideas, thoughts, questions or worry; silent on the outside, but inside there is a noise of competing thoughts.

For others, the idea of being silent itself might be problematic because we see the damage that has been done when people have been silenced, or because we see too much about which we feel we should not, cannot, keep silent (e.g. poverty).

Perhaps you are thinking that Christmas is hardly the appropriate time for silence! What about all the Christmas cheer? What about angels filling the skies and singing "Glory to God"?

But keeping silence is a part of Christmas too.

One of the most well-known carols begins, "Silent night". When the angel first appears to Mary to announce she is pregnant, she is confused, she ponders what greeting she is given, but initially she does not speak (Luke 1: 29). Does Mary keep silent here because she instinctively realises that this is a time to listen? There will be a time to give thanks, to praise (Luke 1:46-55), but for now, she needs to listen, to seek to hear, to take in, all that God is doing.

Later, when the shepherds appear in Bethlehem after the birth, they are the ones talking of what has been made known to them, and leave telling of all that has been seen and heard. But again, Mary appears to be silent, treasuring the shepherd's words and pondering them in her heart (Luke 2: 19). Is her silence here one of intimacy? A silence through which God speaks tenderly of the blessings of what has begun that night.

In both these instances, silence is an appropriate response. Were Mary to speak, it would seem to jar with the sweep of the story – God is at work, God is the central character, not Mary. Words might get in the way. Mary's silence creates space for God's grace to be at work. For the gift to be received.

As part of the rhythm of discipleship, when and where will you keep silent this Christmas? How will you use silence to listen for God, to take in what God is doing? Perhaps you too, in the stillness, and the slowing of silence, will discover a deeper intimacy with God.

Cranbrook & Cornerstone Prayer Day

This gave me plenty of new information about that ever-growing new town, and its various needs and challenges. From it's beginning in September 2012, when the first residents moved in, there have been a few dedicated Christian workers making up the Cornerstone Church there. The first minister, Mark Gilborson, and others visited and welcomed all new house occupiers and began to form a real community working for all who lived there, enabling different groups to form and build each other up.

As time has passed, this continues as part of the work of their present minister, Lythan Nevard. I learned there are now 43 different community groups in Cranbrook, some part of larger outside organisations; but some set up by and for Cranbrook folk - from a Running Group to BSL/British Sign Language Social Group, and 41 others as well!

Lythan shared the challenges of Cornerstone Church organised events some overwhelmed by the numbers attending, and others hardly attended at all. She asked for our continuing prayers for the town and Cornerstone Church; and gave thanks for all that is good in their growing community.

In 1964, we travelled up this long, windy and overgrown drive and as we passed the old red glass lantern a huge 60 room mansion came into view. We visited on several weekends and then mum said that this was going to be our new home.

Mum was a trained district nurse and became a live-in secretary to a new Christian Community on the outskirts of Withycombe Raleigh. We moved into Bystock on August 4th 1965.

To me, an 8 year old boy, it was a wonderland, especially with my best friends Mark and Laura. Let me tell you about two of those 60 rooms.

The hallway, walled with reindeer heads, had a splendid stairway, that Father Christmas would come down, ringing his bell, to be greeted by the children, all the while being watched by the eyes of Jesus, who followed you wherever you went from the painting opposite. After Father Christmas was led into a magnificent ballroom, which had elaborate chandeliers and a huge fireplace, to a really tall and decorated Christmas Tree. From under the tree Father Christmas called us each by name to receive our very own present.

Bystock, truly was a Winter Wonderland, when snow laid all around and a foretaste of heaven on earth.

I dedicate this article to my dear mum who passed away in February of this year, who is united with her friends and family in one of those mansions today.







ICAN win Nobel Peace Prize

The Revd Loraine N Mellor and Jill Baker, the President and the Vice-President of the Methodist Conference, congratulated the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) on being awarded the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize.

ICAN, a coalition of hundreds of non-governmental organisations and faith groups, received the award after being instrumental in getting the majority of the world's nations to sign up to a UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

The Revd Loraine N Mellor said: "Nuclear weapons are totally opposed to the love that God has for humankind. They represent a denial of hope, a challenge to community and a threat to peace. We live in a world of tension and it is becoming abundantly clear that nuclear weapons do not make us safer but are themselves a source of fear and dispute."

The Methodist Church has consistently stated that nuclear weapons are incompatible with ethical principles and international law. It has advocated for the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons through resources and support of community action. Methodist Church leaders and members have joined with other churches and faith groups in the UK on many occasions, for example with statements in 2015 and in 2016.
