

A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

Some of you will know that over the past year I've been reading Running Over Rocks by Ian Adams. It's a book exploring various spiritual practices. I have just started a section entitled "Practices of Possibility – from loss towards grace: the art of looking up". Ian begins the section with a short introduction, where he talks about negotiating a boulder field. He observes that as we walk through a boulder field, our eyes are naturally drawn down to the rocks where we place our feet. However, to travel well, or even run, through the boulder field, he argues that we need to look up, to the horizon and the bigger picture, and notice the individual rocks only in our peripheral vision.

This resonated deeply not only with my own experience in the mountains, but with where I find myself at the moment. At times it's easy to see the process of moving on as a boulder field. Easy to be drawn to the individual rocks in the path; all the practical arrangements of moving a family, the need to hand things on, coming to terms with the fact that everything is not nicely finished off or where I might like it to be, saying goodbye, the uncertainty.

The challenge is to look up, to notice the horizon and see the bigger picture, rather than just the immediate rocks in the path. To remember being excited about the profile of the next appointment, the opportunities that await, the knowledge that I have played my part here in this place, and that God has provided others to continue to live and love, witness and minister in this place. Doing this helps put the rocks in perspective. They still need to be negotiated, it might not be easy, but they are not the only thing in view, there is more opening up on the horizon.

I wonder, what rocks might seem to be in your path? What is it that draws your attention? What else might you notice if you lifted your eyes to the horizon? What might be opening up before you? Would this enable you to travel better through the boulder field?

And as I lift my eyes to the horizon, I remember that it is 360 degrees; it stretches behind as well as in front. I notice those rocks over which I have already passed, challenges that by God's grace were not insurmountable. I notice too that these are only a small part of that receding horizon. There is much more besides. Much to give thanks for; those who have journeyed alongside, encouraging and nurturing; moments of joy; places of encounter with others, with God; periods of growth; learning about the way that is

walked; for grace and love, patience and compassion. For the part that each of you has played in shaping that horizon, I thank you.

As I look to the horizon, I find there is much to draw strength and encouragement from for the journey. I pray that as you lift your eyes to the horizon, you too will be enabled to walk well over whatever rocks lie before you.

"Our attention is easily drawn to the rocks of our losses while the world around is quietly burning with grace. Let's look up!" [Ian Adams, Running Over Rocks, p.137]



JoyFest Update

Below is a brief summary of Joyfest across Exeter:

"Through the app we recorded 362 acts that shared joy with 1,823 people.



Of this, 96.2% of people who received an

act of joy were happy or extremely happy. And 97.3% of Christians performing the acts felt happy or extremely happy afterwards.

However this isn't anything like the full story... I've heard of countless fun, creative, impressive and/or simple acts being done but not being put in the app.

Including:

- Hundreds of people at the Riverside "Joyfest" fun day where free drinks and cakes were given away during 'happy hour'
- All the users of the Mint and the Palace Gate Centre being given snacks
- Every one of the 150ish guest at Exwick's Long Table even getting a goody bag of sweets
- Numerous cakes, sweets, ice creams being given away
- Lots of TGI Friday lunches, BBQs, drinks and parties
- Neighbours, colleagues and strangers being joy'd

So, without wanting to fall into the classic evangelists-blunder, I think we can say at least 2.6 billion people experienced a brightened day by Joyfest Well, perhaps not, but I'm sure we must have connected with around 4,000 people... in one week... by the efforts of lots of normal, diverse and wonderful people within our churches!

I think many of us found there was a real openness to this and people had an appetite to smile, laugh and connect. And I hope you found people in your church were energised by this too!

Thanks so much for being part of it and helping make it happen."

The Start

In 2007 Exeter had three Christian bookshops: S.P.C.K., Wesley Owen and the Cathedral shop. When the first 2 shops closed and the Cathedral shop became more of a gift shop, John and Margaret Robertson felt strongly that the city and region needed a well-stocked Christian bookshop to serve the local churches and community.

In June of 2008 they opened Bridge Books. The venture was never going to be straightforward, but they experienced many practical encouragements including shelving from Wesley Owen and Exeter City Council tailoring a lease to match the needs and fitting a lowered ceiling and lighting at their expense. They had always envisaged that the ministry was to establish Bridge Books and then hand it to someone younger with a similar vision. In March 2012 Gary and Mary Lee were called to continue the ministry'.

The Future

We want to set the shop up for the next 10 years.

Practically, it would be great to:

- Replace the shop front door making it easier for pushchairs and wheelchairs to enter
- Replace two old display stands
- Replace welcome mat
- Reorder the small office
- Paint front of shop
- Renew front sign

Please pray that the £4500 needed will be made available.

For six years we have led the ministry at Bridge Books. To be sure that the ministry will continue to grow and be part of the Christian community for the next 10 years, Mary & I think it would be good to start praying about who would take the ministry on in the future.


I'd like to know by Sun 15th July, please; and will ask you for your money in mid-August when I give you your copy.

BOOK REVIEW (By Andrew R. Simpson)

Experience the Blessing: Testimonies from Toronto.

In January 1994 something remarkable happened in a small industrial unit on Toronto airport. The leaders of the church there had been dissatisfied with their meetings: they wanted to experience more of God; something more real. After attending a number of revivals in Canada and Argentina John and carol



Arnott developed heightened expectations. In the Introduction to this book the pastor Arnott quotes the scripture Ephesians 5:19, that believers should know '...what is the breadth and length, and depth and height, and to know the love of Christ which passeth all understanding, that you may be filled with all his fullness.' When Paul wrote this he was trying to express an experience that he himself had witnessed, but which few Christians today can really comprehend: he was talking literally.

These days Christians may think that what he describes is a thing of the past, a phenomena that passed away in the 1980s as a small revival in England and America seemed to fade from view. They think, perhaps that it is now impossible to know the love of God as the early disciples did. The experience at Toronto appears to disprove this. The Arnotts decided to devote their mornings to the Lord in prayer, Bible study and worship. Their lives became changed dramatically because of this, the book recounts, and they 'fell back in love with Jesus.'

If you are a staunch Methodist you may be very sceptical, even condemning, of reports coming out of Toronto: people barking like dogs and rolling around the floor, waving their hands in the air erratically. Today there are films on 'You Tube' made during the meetings where the congregation seem to behave extraordinarily, and you cannot help but think, not having been there, 'they must be putting it on.' There are numerous reports of worshippers being 'soaked' in the Spirit; collapsing on the floor. But the 28 testimonies in this book, from all types of individuals, are to a large extent from people who 'didn't believe it could happen to them'. Some rejected the reports outright; some were desperate, like a pilgrim going to Lourdes as a last resort; some were cynical and disillusioned. But all the reports give witness to a life changing experience. Scott McDermott, an American United Methodist Church pastor, extremely sceptical beforehand of what he had 'products of overactive imaginations', heard, who dismissed these as experienced one of the most incredible encounters with the Lord that Arnott had ever witnessed: a vision of himself running uphill from Jericho to Jerusalem to be embraced by the arms of Jesus. He was literally amazed by his experience and subsequently pointed out that, in 1739, over 200 years earlier, as reported in his 'Journal' John Wesley, McDermott records, himself found members of his congregation collapsing on the floor in his meetings. Rather than condemning this he sought to understand what had happened by listening to their experiences.

The 28 accounts in this book, which include those of a New York Supreme Court judge, an American physician, a British Anglican minister, a burnt out missionary from Mozambique and many others, serve to confirm that God can still work in unbelievably miraculous ways, healing his worshippers both emotionally and physically. Even if you are sceptical and dismissive of the Toronto reports, it is worth perusing this book before finally deciding the Truth.

'Experiencing the Blessing: Testimonies from Toronto', edited by John Arnott, was published as a paperback by Renewal Books in 2000.

Praying for Syria


In response to the recent events in Syria the President and Vice-President of the Conference, the Revd Loraine N Mellor and Jill Baker, have offered this prayer.
