A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

Psalm 78

How often do we hear it said that churches are in trouble these days because they won't do anything new? That they are so hidebound and wedded to the way 'we always do things' that the rest of the world has just lost interest in us? Given that this seems to be the received wisdom of our day, I'm going to say something radical and shocking: we are most spiritually at risk, not when we fail to do anything sufficiently new, but when we forget. When we forget why we became Christians, when we forget what God has done for us, when we forget about His life-changing grace and His abundant mercy. In our life together, particularly when we gather for worship, what matters most is that what we do holds before us the great story of God and His people and how we are part of it.

The supreme example of this is communion. Jesus commanded us to commemorate His death precisely because we so easily forget, and yet is by remembering the unchanging truths of our faith, regularly, faithfully, gratefully, that these truths sink into us and transform us. All this is a long and rambling way of introducing Psalm 78! Put simply, this Psalm recounts all the mighty acts through which God has saved, and revealed Himself to, Israel, followed by a rebuke for forgetting all this - and for the inevitable backsliding which followed as a result. However, nothing changes the fact that God is compassionate and full to bursting with grace and mercy which means the door is always open for His erring people to return and begin again. In our Christian discipleship, remembering is so much more important than novelty, so perhaps if we feel discouraged or have hit a spiritual 'dry patch', then it might be time to attend the long neglected garden, to retire the ancient ruins, to relight the lamp in the sanctuary, to let daylight flood into our souls once more as we recall the acts by which God has brought us back to Himself and made a rich, abundant life possible. Then, whatever else might be going on around us, we will at least be able to say, 'He shepherded is with His upright heart, and with skilful hands He led us'. Amen!

Christ Present in the Struggle

Life is one big struggle for millions worldwide. Climate change in some countries produces a year's rainfall in just one day, floods sweeping away homes and thousands displaced. Other countries are devastated by drought, earthquakes or fires, preventing the sowing of crops and future harvests. Millions are on the edge of starvation in places like Sudan, Gaza, Haiti, to mention just a few.

In our own country, whichever party wins the election, thousands struggle daily because of rising food prices, rent increases or loss of job. Many even in full-time employment depend on food banks to scrape by financially. The toll on mental health is immense. For many families life remains one big struggle.

C.S. Lewis states that even when we know everything about our impending NHS hospital operation, our heart still gives a lurch when the attendant brings the trolley! But he insists that the Christian knows that Jesus will be there too!

God doesn't say, "I will deliver you from the waters," but "when you pass through the engulfing waters, I will be there with you." In the well-known, uplifting story of the Dutch ten Boom family being arrested by the Gestapo, a German officer counted them on to the truck, en-route to Ravensbruck Concentration Camp. He counted six, but Caspar ten Boom shouted, "No! Seven. God is with us!" And what an appalling struggle life was in that concentration camp.


Christ Himself experienced the tunnel of darkness in the Garden of Gethsemane. "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Take this cup from me! Yet not what I will, but what You will." An angel from heaven appeared and strengthened Him.

In May 1992, I led my Church group into the Garden of Resurrection in Jerusalem. It was an intense time, because Israel were celebrating 25 years since defeating the Palestinians, and had drafted in 45,000 soldiers for this noisy occasion of soldiers marching intimidatingly round the Arab community, waving flags, while a helicopter hovered above us.

In contrast, our party's inspiration was watching hundreds of Christians from all over the world coming out of that Garden Tomb with joy on their faces, all saying the same words (in different languages) "HE IS RISEN!" This Risen Christ is with us in ALL our struggles. As Corrie ten Boom says, "When a train goes through a tunnel, and it gets dark, you don't throw away the ticket and jump off!"

St Paul struggled for many years planting the Gospel in many different cities. His darkest tunnel came when he faced execution in Rome for his faith. Earlier he had written to a young minister, Timothy, "I have no regrets. I couldn't be more sure of my ground. The One I've trusted in can take care of what He's trusted me to do, right to the end."
