A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

One of the things I have found most troubling about this General Election campaign is Theresa May's talk of 'Strong and Stable' leadership. Let me clear before I'm accused of being party political – I'm not intending to comment on Theresa May's ability to provide strong and stable leadership (or any other politician's ability in this regard either). What troubles me is the apparently widespread view that this is what we need.

Do we really want, or need, strong leaders? I suppose it depends how we understand strong. Of course we want leaders who are competent and able. I'd love our leaders to show moral firmness and courage, to have leaders who are full of vigour.

The trouble is that too often strong leadership becomes about strength and power. About the ability to use power to successfully achieve our ends. When understood in this way, it can quickly become associated with aggression and wilfulness (and there are plenty of historical examples of this from the left or right of the political spectrum). We seem to think that being a strong leader means we must not show weakness. But the effort not to show weakness can mean that people don't see us for who we are. For me, this starts to raise questions about integrity and whether we can really trust someone if they are constantly wearing a mask or trying to project a certain image.

I guess none of us would want a weak leader, but what about a vulnerable leader? Someone who was willing to relinquish the power to protect themselves and be wounded for the sake of others (John 19:10-11, Philippians 2:4-7). Someone who was willing to put their power at the service of others (John 2: 1-11). Someone who didn't always presume to know what was best, but engaged and responded to people (Mark 10: 51-52), and even allowed them to change the course of action (Mark 7:24-30). Someone who acted from compassion (Matthew 14: 13-21) and was willing to show emotion (John 11: 33-35). Someone whose mission was not to maintain the status quo, but risked condemnation by proclaiming a manifesto in favour of the poor and marginalised (Luke 4:18-19).

Such a vulnerable leader would be worth not just voting for, but following. It would be an example not just inspiring those who aspire to leadership, but all of us. Might I suggest that we keep this example of vulnerable leadership in mind as we head to the polls.
