


A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

The root of the word 'religion' means 'to see', and the difference between a religious and a secular outlook on life is that the former encourages you to see your life as a gift, something given, something intended, and something with a purpose. If you see life as a gift in this way, you will value it, and seek to make the most of it. If however, you see life as having no purpose at all, as having no meaning and no direction, it will have very little value for you and what you do with your life won't matter to you so much. I would suggest that the religious are those who 'see' that bit further, who have caught a glimpse of the mystery at the heart of existence, and who know beyond doubt that what they can see is not all there is.

Christian faith goes one further and says that this 'something more' has touched human history, embraced flesh and blood, the divine becoming human in order to bring humanity back to the divine. This is an astonishing claim, that He who created all that exists, somehow inhabited a human life, and through that human life, opened up a way for us to be connected with Him. Those who open up their lives to God in this way find a new, transformed life possible, made possible by the help of the Spirit of God. This is powerful, life-changing stuff, and all too often, churches keep quiet about all this, and forget that their urgent task is to pray that others will come to know all this for themselves, and to pray too, for opportunities to speak positively of their faith in ways that that will attract and encourage others to want to know more. Many suspect that there is more to life than meets the eye. Those of use who know they are right need to tell them so – with the help of God's Spirit and always encouraging each other as we do so.

Up the mountain and in the wilderness at Torquay

We were also "by the grave" and "on the beach", these being the titles of the four addresses given at the Methodist Evangelicals Together (MET) South West Regional Conference over the last weekend of January. Over 100 of us gathered for this annual event held at The Livermead Cliff Hotel, right on the English Riviera Seafront. Our speaker was Rev Dr David Coffey, sometime General Secretary of the Baptist Union and also President of the Baptist World Alliance, his overall theme being "Mentored by Jesus". David chose four scenarios, the sermon on the mount, the feeding of the 5000, the raising of Lazarus and the post-resurrection appearance on the beach, in all of which Jesus mentored his disciples in their responsibilities and privileges as his envoys. David's scholarly, humorous and pastoral approach shone through each of these sessions. I remember being particularly challenged by his question as to how our churches would cope with a sudden influx of new born Christians and enquirers in the event of local or national revival The four talks are available from Ground Vision (www.groundvision.org) either individually or as a box set and would make excellent house group material.

Over the weekend we were also introduced to the new MET Development Worker, Rev Derek Balsdon; we heard about the work of Wesley Cottage from John Hogarth, and the Rev Graham Shaw spoke to us about the challenging situation in Zimbabwe and the issues facing the Christian people there. Rev Steve Wild (Chair of Cornwall District) gave an entertaining and challenging life story/testimony on the Saturday afternoon

in which he highlighted the many evangelistic opportunities offered by everyday encounters with people. Rev Graham Thompson (Chair Plymouth and Exeter) also gave a pastoral word at the Saturday evening Celebration (led musically by the Wonford Methodist Church Worship Group) at which we also heard good news from local churches in the SW. The closing communion service was imaginatively and sensitively led by Rev Doreen Sparey-Delacassa, involving a dramatic presentation of the events around the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our love offering at the Saturday Celebration amounted to over £1800, one third of which will go to the Zimbabwe Victims Support Fund.

Altogether it was a superb weekend in which we were all richly blessed by the ministry and by the wonderful hospitality and the delicious food at the hotel. What an ideal venue it is; and we are booked in there again for January 24th to 26th 2020 when our main speaker will be Rev David Hull (Current chair of MET and chaplain at Kingswood School). Do note the date and watch for further info on the MET website.


