A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

I mentioned last month that the Methodist Church is being encouraged to reflect on 5 disciplines, or rhythms, of discipleship and mission over the coming year; give thanks / keep silence / pray / act / read & reflect. This month we begin to look at these in a bit more detail, starting with "Give thanks". In his letter to the church in Thessalonica, Paul encourages the believers there to "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thess 5:18).

There are times when Paul's encouragement seems unnecessary. Times when giving thanks to someone, or to God, is easy and natural. Times when our hearts overflow with gratitude and words come easily. Perhaps this is because it's our birthday and the gifts we've received are obvious and wrapped in front of us, perhaps because we have been deeply touched by the thoughtfulness or care of someone, or perhaps because we have been moved by the beauty of something. There are equally times when Paul's encouragement feels absurd. Times when giving thanks to someone, or even especially to God, seems difficult, maybe impossible. Times when gratitude is the last thing on our mind and things look bleak. Perhaps because the situation we are facing is overwhelming, perhaps because we are deeply touched by tragedy, illness, or pain, or perhaps because we are moved by injustice and suffering. Paul's encouragement to give thanks in all circumstances then seems to us to be inappropriate.

Yet Paul's understanding of giving thanks goes beyond feeling. At times Paul was writing letters from prison, or from house arrest, hardly circumstances in which we would naturally give thanks! Yet Paul begins each of his letters by doing just that; even if his situation doesn't lead to thanks, he can thank God for the faith of others, for what God is doing through them. For Paul, gratitude is a discipline. It is a rhythm that we learn to practice. Sometimes it might involve looking beyond our immediate situation and rooting our thanks not in our natural feelings, which ebb and flow, but in the nature and character of God, whose love remains steadfast, who is gracious and compassionate.

So as we learn to practice these rhythms of discipleship and mission, how might you complete the following sentence each day this month?

Justice EMail

Methodists affirm that one aspect of "Our Calling" is to Service, which includes "challenging injustice".



There are many issues of injustice in the world, on many different levels, and it can be difficult to know where to begin. I don't know enough about what's going on, we might think. How can I make a difference? It's easy to feel overwhelmed.

This is where Justice Mail can help!

Justice Mail is a simple e-mail system that encourages individuals to take action on issues of injustice. It seeks to support the campaigns of many of the major development and justice organisations in the UK (e.g. Amnesty International, Church Action on Poverty, Labour Behind the Label, Christian Aid, Fairtrade, Greenpeace, Refugee Action, Shelter, WaterAid, Stop the Traffik).

Sign up for Wonford Justice Mail and once a month you will receive an email that provides you with both information about a particular issue, and details of how you can take some simple steps to take action in this area (e.g. signing a petition or sending an e-mail). Signing up to the Justice Mail list does not commit you to doing anything – each month you are free to decide whether you wish to take action – the e-mail acts as a prompt and provides information.

The creation of a Wonford Justice Mail list has been approved by the Church Council and will be managed by Bill Noronha. To become a part of the list and start taking action, just e-mail Bill: <u>billnoronha@hotmail.co.uk</u> – it's as easy as that!

Shoebox Appeal 2017

This year we are collecting boxes through Blythswood Care, which is an established Christian charity based in Glasgow, Scotland. They bring hope to families in Europe, Africa and Asia through filled shoeboxes at Christmas, relief and development aid or social projects for young and old. Their motto is 'transforming lives through Christian care for body and soul'.



The boxes are covered in wrapping paper in the same way as last year but can now be for adults as well as teenagers and children. The categories are Elderly Woman, Man, Woman, Teenage Boy, Teenage Girl, Boy or Girl. I will bring in some sample boxes and the leaflets, which provide a checklist of items that can be put in the shoeboxes. These include toiletries, stationery, toys & sweets as well as some items of clothing. Unlike the charity we supported last year, Blythswood have decided to keep the donation towards costs down at £3 per shoebox. Date for final collection at Wonford Methodist is Sunday 12th November.

Disaster relief for the Caribbean

The Methodist Church in Britain is raising money to support the humanitarian aid and relief work following the heavy rains and winds causing disaster across the Caribbean.

The Church is working with its humanitarian aid and relief partner in the Caribbean, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which is supporting affected communities as soon as their needs are assessed.

Following Hurricane Irma, Bishop Otto Wade, the President of the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas, wrote that "Barbuda, Antigua's sister isle has been devastated. Anguilla, St Martin/Sint Maarten, USVI, and the British Virgin Islands were all greatly affected. As was the Turks and Caicos Islands of the Bahamas/Turks and Caicos Islands Conference. Many homes have been destroyed or have lost their roofs, as have some churches."

Rohingya Refugee Crisis Appeal

All We Can and the Methodist Church in Britain are calling for support for this urgent appeal for refugees displaced by the recent violence in Myanmar.

Over the past few weeks, more than half a million people have fled violence in Myanmar's Rakhine State. The majority of those fleeing are Rohingya women and children.

All We Can and the Methodist Church in Britain are calling for generous support for this urgent appeal to assist those seeking refuge in Bangladesh. People are in desperate need of water, food, shelter and access to medical care.

Since violence flared up in Myanmar in late August, an estimated 519,000 Rohingya people have sought shelter and safety in Bangladesh. Many are currently living in temporary, unsanitary structures constructed out of plastic sheeting and bamboo in informal camps and settlements. Refugees are arriving in Bangladesh exhausted and traumatised and camps and local host communities are struggling to respond to the scale of this disaster.

Food insecurity is one of the primary areas of concern, while providing health care, access to safe water and mitigating the threat of disease is critical. Heavy rains in recent days have made an already precarious situation worse for refugees trying to seek shelter in sub-standard housing and makeshift camps. All We Can's partner is responding to this emergency and is calling for urgent funds to help reach people suffering because of this crisis.

Humanitarian Aid Manager Jason Snuggs said: "Earlier this week, the United Nations spoke about the pressure Rohingya refugees are facing. People are arriving in Bangladesh fearful, exhausted and hungry, and in desperate need of immediate help.

"Many bring with them accounts of brutality and report having seen and suffered atrocities that have left them traumatised. Meeting the urgent needs of these refugees who have already suffered so much is critical. That is why we have launched this urgent appeal."
