

A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

At the very centre of the Christian faith is the conviction that there is no God but the God revealed to us in Jesus Christ. Sadly, that doesn't stop us worshipping many other gods, gods of our own imagining. We might imagine an angry policeman god. The Father Christmas god. The god who does nothing but bring guilt and fear into his supposedly beloved children. How do we reach beyond these distorted pictures of God and embrace the real thing? Go back to the first sentence: when we see Jesus, we see who God is and we learn that His nature is love and His grace limitless. Being a Christian means nothing less than embarking on a lifelong journey with Jesus, and getting ever closer to the heart of God through prayer, worship, and a conscious decision, every day, to commit ourselves to Jesus afresh and to live by the guiding and strengthening of the Holy Spirit.

One of my great concerns is that, in this country at least, Christianity has come to mean a set of moral instructions, of bland platitudes, being a 'nice' person. That's a feeble, watered down version of the life changing faith that following Jesus really is. It's a privilege and a joy and the only really fulfilling way to live because — and this is those who see Christian faith as just another 'lifestyle choice' fail to understand — it's what we were created for. Another amazing truth is that, the further we go along this road, the more we become, not religious robots, but our authentic, true selves, the people God wants, and always intended us to be. This doesn't necessarily make us perfect or better than others. If anything, it makes us more conscious of our need for God and of the ways we fall short of who we could be. It does though, mean that we are equipped to make a real imprint on the world. As St. Catherine of Siena advises, "Be who God created you to be and you will set the world on fire".

Wildlife Winter Wonderland

As we welcome in another season, we have started to get used to putting on our coats and heating our homes. However, looking in my garden I am reminded that God's smaller creatures also have to adapt but for them it is a bit more difficult: it is about surviving the winter.



There are a few things that we can do to help our wildlife at this time of year as harsher weather approaches. I enjoy encouraging birds in to our garden and in colder weather food can be scarce so I hang up bird feeders with peanuts and fat balls, halved apples on the ground, put out meal worms and make sure their water is clean & not frozen over.

Many creatures will need a warm, safe & sheltered spot to over winter. I try not to tidy up the garden too much – wildlife will benefit from a pile of leaves left in a sheltered corner or a bundle of twigs/small branches on the ground and I refrain from cutting back ornamental grasses which can provide a little safe haven. Even the seed-heads on the spent summer flowers can be left for some birds to eat, along with the fallen fruit and berries.

If you only have a small space, a window box or patio pots you can still help wildlife by putting out a bit of food & water for the birds – in our garden this has also attracted squirrels, field mice & even foxes! You can also plant a few bulbs for the bees to enjoy in the spring – crocuses and scented daffodils are good for our little pollen seekers as well as for us humans to enjoy.

Shoebox Appeal 2018

Just think for a moment, a filled shoebox may be the only gift they have ever been given - their first gift, ever. Imagine the joy when they receive a box and then discover the presents inside - what a Christmas present for someone truly in need!

We are collecting boxes through Blythswood Care again this year, which is an established Christian charity based in Glasgow, Scotland. They bring hope to families in Europe, Africa and Asia through filled shoeboxes at Christmas, relief and development aid or social projects for young and old. Their motto is 'transforming lives through Christian care for body and soul'.

You need to cover a shoebox in wrapping paper with the lid wrapped separately and they can be for adults as well as teenagers and children. The categories are; Elderly Woman, Man, Woman, Teenage Boy, Teenage Girl, Boy or Girl.

I will bring in some sample boxes and the leaflets, which provide a full checklist of items that can be put in the shoeboxes. These include toiletries, hats & scarves, stationery, toys & sweets as well as some other items of clothing. For the adults things like candles, a hand powered torch or kitchen utensils are very useful. The donation towards cost of transporting each shoebox is £3. Date for final collection at Wonford Methodist is Sunday 18th November.



Most important items - toothbrush & toothpaste, soap & flannel, hat/scarf/gloves, sweets (dated at least March 2019), a small toy and pencils/pens/paper.

Other suggested items for children - a ball, skipping rope, hair accessories, puzzles, stickers. For adults - shampoo, deodorant, comb, sewing equipment, candles (but no matches), kitchen utensils, screwdriver/pliers, pack of cards, small wind up torch and for teenage girls/woman- sanitary products.

You might like to add in a Christmas card with a message, your name & town/country but do not put in your address.

If you have any questions or you want to donate a few items or money instead of filling a box then please let me know - all contributions are very welcome and will help to put a smile on the faces of people who live in such poverty. This shoebox may be the only gift they have ever been given.
