A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

At Synod recently, Graham Thompson, our District chair talked about a 'year of prayer' and of how he wanted to encourage deeper and more committed prayer across the district. The trouble with prayer sometimes is, we just don't know where to start. What I say to that is, start with scripture, and let the Word of God teach you to pray. I've put together for you a sort of prayer diary which may help to guide you in your prayers. You don't have to stick to it rigidly – let it be a springboard to assist you as you let God's word inspire you! The Bible is stuffed with prayers and they are often impassioned and extravagant, but always heartfelt – nothing timid or lukewarm here!. Let's learn from our ancestors in the faith how to bring ourselves fully, honestly, beseechingly before God in prayer. You'll need your Bible handy to look up the references!

Sunday - Ephesians 3.14-16.

On the day that we meet to worship together, Paul's prayer to the Ephesians church is apt. Paul prays nothing less than that they will experience to the uttermost the extent of God's love for them so that they can live richly, deeply and fully as Christ's people.

Monday - Psalm 3.

This is the prayer of someone up to their necks, who feels they can't cope any more. Like many of the Psalms, it's raw and honest but shot through with hope and trust in God.

Tuesday - Psalm 51.

Clearly, the prayer of someone who has messed up quite spectacularly and needs more than forgiveness – the Psalmist needs to be renewed, restored, refreshed and given the chance to make a new start. The Psalmist is in no doubt that God will grant it.

Wednesday - Psalm 139.

This is the prayer of someone delighting in their relationship with God which is at once cosily intimate and utterly awe inspiring (God knew and loved before we were even born is the message!)

Thursday - 1 Samuel 2.1-10.

In this famous prayer, like the even more famous Magnificat, Hannah, who has pleaded with God for a son, experiences an answer to prayer which opens her eyes to how God works – tending and watching over the outcasts and marginalised and humbling the arrogant.

Friday - Nehemiah 1. 1,2-9.

Nehemiah finds himself the leader of a people who have endured exile and loss and are yearning for home. This is still the experience of too many around the world and we are called to bring the brokenness and the divisions of our world to God in that essential task we call 'interceding'.

Saturday - Matthew 6. 5-15.

The Lord's Prayer. No commentary needed! Say the words of this prayer slowly, and put your heart into each word.

Shoebox Appeal 2018

Just think for a moment, a filled shoebox may be the only gift they have ever been given - their first gift, ever. Imagine the joy when they receive a box and then discover the presents inside - what a Christmas present for someone truly in need!

We are collecting boxes through Blythswood Care again this year, which is an established Christian charity based in Glasgow, Scotland. They bring hope to families in Europe, Africa and Asia through filled shoeboxes at Christmas, relief and development aid or social projects for young and old. Their motto is 'transforming lives through Christian care for body and soul'.



You need to cover a shoebox in wrapping paper with the lid wrapped separately and they can be for adults as well as teenagers and children. The categories are; Elderly Woman, Man, Woman, Teenage Boy, Teenage Girl, Boy or Girl.

I will bring in some sample boxes and the leaflets, which provide a full checklist of items that can be put in the shoeboxes. These include toiletries, hats & scarves, stationery, toys & sweets as well as some other items of clothing. For the adults things like candles, a hand powered torch or kitchen utensils are very useful. The donation towards cost of transporting each shoebox is £3. Date for final collection at Wonford Methodist is Sunday 18th November.

Most important items - toothbrush & toothpaste, soap & flannel, hat/scarf/ gloves, sweets (dated at least March 2019), a small toy and pencils/pens/ paper.

Other suggested items for children - a ball, skipping rope, hair accessories, puzzles, stickers. For adults - shampoo, deodorant, comb, sewing equipment, candles (but no matches), kitchen utensils, screwdriver/pliers, pack of cards, small wind up torch and for teenage girls/woman- sanitary products.

You might like to add in a Christmas card with a message, your name & town/country but do not put in your address.

If you have any questions or you want to donate a few items or money instead of filling a box then please let me know - all contributions are very welcome and will help to put a smile on the faces of people who live in such poverty. This shoebox may be the only gift they have ever been given. **Sue Keatt**

PS. We really do need empty & unwanted shoeboxes to wrap so if you have any then please bring them in!

Long, Hot Summer!

I was going to start by saying that I am a keen gardener but describing myself as a gardener implies some knowledge and I just stick plants in and hope for the best! So instead I'll say that I really enjoy gardening!

This long, hot summer has been wonderful but it has been a challenge to keep my plants alive! I have used 'grey' water (bath and washing up water) on my flowerbeds and water from the water butt for my pots. I also used water from the butt to water my tomatoes as I didn't want them tasting of soap! There have been a few casualties but generally the garden has survived.

Girls' Brigade had a theme of 'Caring for Creation' last term and we planted bee friendly sunflowers. A big thank you to everyone who watered them for us! I am conscious though that we used tap water for this. Though water isn't scarce in the UK it needs substantial amounts of energy to extract, transport and treat it so when we use less tap water we save energy. Perhaps we could have a water butt at Church so we can collect rain water for the plants and save the tap water for us!

Gift Aid Secretary

Gift Aid is a government scheme which increases the value of donations made by tax payers to certain charities. As a church we benefit through this scheme and are able to claim several thousand pounds through it each year. I have administered this scheme for us over the past few years, but will be standing down from this role from May 2019. Although this seems a long way off, I would love to have someone work alongside me over this coming year so they can learn the ropes and ensure a smooth transition. If you'd like to know more, please speak with me [and also if you're a tax payer and don't already Gift Aid your donation!]. Although much of this work happens when no-one can see what is being done it is an important role.

This role should not take up too much of your time. The main work happens from mid-February to May when the weekly envelopes are prepared and given out before the beginning of April. During April/May the gift aid claim is made, and Church House is always there to support you with any help you may need. My replacement will need to be computer literate as all claims are made online with the use of e-mail, however this is not a complicated form to complete! Otherwise it is mainly record keeping, encouraging people to gift aid their offering and making sure weekly envelopes are ordered in a timely fashion. The record keeping can be done with the help of a computer or manually. I have found using a computer helpful but realise this may not suit everyone! So the main activity for this role is around Feb, March, April and May, roughly when the financial year is changing, so if anyone feels they are able to take over this role I would love to hear from them so I can guide them through the duties and perhaps some of their first year as Gift Aid Secretary. Without a Gift Aid Secretary we would not be able to claim the generous amounts we are at present claiming, so do consider this role very prayerfully.
