


A Message From The Minister

Dear Friends,

I don't know if you have ever travelled first class by train. I haven't and I'm never going to because a) I'm from Yorkshire and b) you don't really get much extra for your money as far as I can see. Plus, a good book and a good view are options for everyone, as far as I can see! However, although I consider myself a very prudent person indeed for opting for second class travel, I am aware that far too many people consider themselves to be second class people. This might be because they have low self-esteem, or others have treated them badly. It may be because they have had a great deal of criticism flung at them, and very little encouragement. All sorts of things can happen as a result. Sometimes they overcompensate by bullying or throwing their weight around. Sometimes they simply go through life with a sense of dejection, feeling they aren't worth very much.

This is very sad indeed, and the Church is sometimes wrongly portrayed as existing for the sole purpose of making people feel bad about themselves. It's true that Paul wrote, "All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God". That is a fact that we can't ignore. As Rowan Williams expressed it, "The Gospel will never tell us we are innocent, but it does tell us we are loved". We are not loved moreover, because of anything we have done or achieved. We cannot 'make' God love us. Praise God, we don't have to, as God knew and loved us before we were even born, simply because we are His.

Remember God so loved the world – that means everyone. It means that every single person on the planet is equal before God, and there is no such thing as a second class person. The gospel of Jesus Christ is good news available to anyone and everyone – faith and trust are all that's needed. The Gospel might not tell us that we are perfect, but it will always tell us that we are completely and unconditionally loved and that there is a great future for us, in which we walk hand in hand with God. We hear a lot at present about how things are going to different as a result of the Covid-19 situation. Very true no doubt. We must not forget the foundational truths of our faith though, which will always be true and are not affected in the least by what's happening around us. If Christ died for us, then we must be worth an awful lot to Him....

As an Eco Church we, at Wonford, are indebted to *A Rocha UK*, who are behind the Eco Church project. One focus is a new initiative called 'Climate Sunday' which many UK Churches across the denominations are joining.

You all will have read the excellent article by Sue Keatt in last month's Contact Newsletter, and her question about Wonford choosing to have a Climate Sunday – and be part of a larger group doing this. Did you send her, or our Minister Ben Haslam, any comments on this suggestion? I do hope so. Although we have already made some progress as an Eco Church there is more to do, as suggested in the 3 points she quotes; and the Church Council recently agreed we would – somehow – be part Exeter's celebration of the national Climate Sunday on Sunday 5th September 2021. However, if Wonford does re-open soon for Services, the showing of the film "Global Healing" - postponed from 26 April, seems unlikely to happen in October. In the meantime, do keep an eye out for any ideas to share with our Green Team members, please; for this will really help our Team to know what you think Wonford Methodist Church folk should do next, to help preserve God's Wonderful World, and limit changes for the worse in the climate.

A Call to Pray for Everyone Involved in Education at This Time

Barbara Easton, head of service for the Methodist Academies and Schools Trust, calls for prayers at this anxious time as schools return

Children have had a very mixed time over the last several months. Many have missed friends and the experience of learning as a community. Some have flourished, spending more time at home than ever before. For a few, more time spent at home has been a time of inescapable trauma. Young people in examination years have been on an emotional roller-coaster which is now reaching its end. Children will receive the reckoning of the generation who went before – those in traditionally high performing schools will be credited with the same high grades as their predecessors; children in

less successful schools will be judged no better than their fore-runners. The exceptional youngster not credited as an individual but as an aberration. Lives, careers and futures in the balance. Schools are facing the challenges of the return to school. Staff and children are anguishing about the full opening, uncertain how to prepare and what to prepare for. The guidance is like 'an ever-flowing stream' and yet more is expected.

And so I ask you to pray:

- · For young people and their families as they deal with their results
- For the people in exam boards, university admissions offices and schools balancing the requirements of process and the futures of young people
- · For everyone involved in the full return to education
- For our Methodist schools across the country, serving and loving in the name of Christ and of the Methodist people
- For Methodist schools and universities across the world, each serving in its own place.
- God of grace, we hold before you everyone involved in education at this time.
- Give peace, righteousness, energy, delight and empathy all in their places

We offer all our young people into your care,

Amen.
